Jak/Bondi's diagnostic criteria

Participants were considered to have MCI if any one of the following three criteria were met:

1) they had an impaired score, defined as >1 SD below the age-corrected normative mean, on both measures within at least one cognitive domain (i.e., memory, language, or speed/executive function);

2) they had one impaired score, defined as >1 SD below the age-corrected normative mean, in each of the three cognitive domains sampled;

or 3) they had a score on the FAQ =9 indicating dependence in three or more daily activities.
